About This School

Helen Hunt Jackson Alternative School is located at 26400 Dartmouth Avenue. Helen Hunt Jackson is an optional 9-12 educational alternative that utilizes independent studies to deliver the district approved curriculum.

While the independent study program in California started out as an option for gifted students, it is now open to any student who can benefit from this type of instruction. Students meet with their teacher once a week to receive and review their assignments, and take guizzes or tests. Most students are required to attend one or more labs each week. They can earn the same amount of credit they would get in any other public school or can choose to earn additional credits through Work Experience, C.T.E., Community Service, and some other options. They are required to complete thirty hours of educational studies each week under the supervision of their parents and to complete and return all assignments to their teacher during their regular appointment. Completion of assignments and the ability to demonstrate the required skills and knowledge is proof that the student was 'in school.'

To succeed in an independent study program, a student must have good reading skills, basic math skills, and the maturity and self discipline to work independently with minimal teacher support. Strong parental support is crucial. Parents assume additional responsibilities when their student is enrolled in independent study. Some students use independent study as a temporary oasis from their regular school while others stay in our program until they graduate. Helen Hunt Jackson School is committed to helping all of our students achieve their goals.
