SWIMMING POOL OPERATOR

JOB SUMMARY

Positions in this class report to the school Plant Manager and are under general supervision. Have full responsibility for cleaning, servicing, and maintaining a swimming pool and all related equipment and machinery. In addition perform custodial duties at swimming pool and in other areas of the school.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Operate heaters, circulating pumps and related equipment;
- Brush and vacuum swimming pool and clean filters;
- Conduct chemical tests of water and apply proper chemicals and adjust amounts to bring pool water to standards of purity and PH levels;
- Maintain filters, back wash, and pump house;
- Brush, skim, drain, and vacuum pool surface;
- Keep pool areas, walkways, and equipment clean, serviced, and safe;
- Clean dressing rooms and restrooms;
- Perform custodial maintenance duties in other areas of the school;
- Maintain simple records pertaining to the swimming pool operation;
- Store, maintain, and set up, as necessary, aquatic athletic equipment;
- Requisition, receive, store, and maintain an adequate inventory of swimming pool supplies and materials.

EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS

KNOWLEDGE OF

- Methods, materials and equipment used in the maintenance and operation of a large swimming pool;
- Pumps and motors used in connection with a large swimming pool;
- Methods, techniques, and procedures used in maintaining and performing routine repairs to related swimming pool equipment;
- Proper methods of testing and treating swimming pool water;
- Appropriate safety precautions and procedures.

ABILITY TO

- Employ proper cleaning, servicing and maintenance techniques and procedures for a large swimming pool;
- Maintain or learn to maintain pool water at proper temperatures, and levels of chemical balance and purity;
- Maintain simple records and prepare reports as necessary;
- Adjust work schedules to accommodate school aquatic activities;
- Read and interpret documents such as safety rules, operating and maintenance instructions, and procedure manuals;
- Write routine reports and correspondence;
- Apply common sense understanding to carry out instructions furnished in written, oral, or diagram form;
- Add, subtract, multiply, and divide in all units of measure, using whole numbers, common fractions, and decimals;
- Use tools and equipment safely;
- Understand and follow oral and written instructions in English;
- Establish and maintain effective working relationships with those contacted in the course of work;
- Respond appropriately to direction and changes in work setting;
- Organize tasks, set priorities, maintain established pace;
- Work with minimal supervision;

EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS

ABILITY TO (Continued)

- Perform repetitive tasks;
- Manage multiple tasks;
- Demonstrate good problem-solving skills.

EDUCATION

High school diploma or general education degree (GED) and possession of the knowledge and abilities listed above.

EXPERIENCE

- One (1) year of experience in the maintenance of swimming pools;
- Successful completion of training in the maintenance and operation of swimming pools may be substituted for the experience.

REQUIRED LICENSES AND/OR CERTIFICATES

- If required to operate a vehicle in the performance of duties, operator must possess a valid California Driver's License;
- Maintain possession of such license during the course of employment;
- Have an acceptable driving record;
- Must be insurable at standard rates by District's insurance carrier and maintain such insurability during the course of employment;
- Certified Pool Operator.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS AND WORKING CONDITIONS

Physical Demands:

Walk (continuously); bend, stoop, reach, push & pull (frequently), to access areas and to operate equipment; lift, up to 25 pounds (frequently), and up to 50 pounds (infrequently); grasp and manipulate tools/ equipment (frequently); use seeing, hearing and speaking.

Working Conditions:

Most work performed outdoors, some indoors. Exposure to: electrically and mechanically operated equipment; cleaning agent odors; floor buffer vibration; seasonal outdoor temperatures (30° -120°) and possible exposure to dust, wind, sun and insects. May work alone.

Reasonable accommodation may be made to enable a person with a disability to perform the essential functions of the job.
